Narrative imagery focuses on women, implying occult experiences and same-sex eroticism; these themes are enhanced by densely elaborated patterns that cover dresses, fill pictorial space and decorate the borders. All together, it suggests an artist in a state of ecstatic creative possession (Johnson).
